# The Healing Ministry of Jesus

## I. PURPOSE OF JESUS' COMING – TO BRING SALVATION, HEALING, & DELIVERANCE

<sup>8</sup>...<u>For this purpose the Son of God was manifested</u>, that <u>He might destroy the works of the devil</u>. (1 Jn. 3:8)

<sup>10</sup>The <u>thief does not come except to steal</u>, and to kill, and to destroy. <u>I have come that they may have</u> <u>life</u>, and that they may have it <u>more abundantly</u>. (Jn. 10:10)

<sup>38</sup>how <u>God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power</u>, who <u>went about doing</u> <u>good</u> and <u>healing all who were oppressed by the devil</u>, for <u>God was with Him</u>. (Ac 10:38)

- A. <u>Jesus came to destroy the very works of the devil</u> Satan attempts to blind man to the true knowledge of God. His works are evident in sin and sickness as a result of agreement with his ways.
- B. <u>Jesus' purpose was to bring life to fallen humanity</u> healing was a central focus of His ministry, which brought life to death in a limited sense. God desires for all to be saved, of which healing is a major tangible, factor in convincing men of God's realness, goodness, and love towards them.

<sup>36</sup>Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed. (Jsa. 8:36)

<sup>1</sup>It was for freedom that Christ set us free...(Gal. 5:1)

C. <u>Jesus came as the anointed one</u> – He preached the good news (gospel) of the kingdom of God. When questioned if He was the messiah he referred to His works of power as a sign of His claim.

<sup>2</sup>And when John <u>had heard</u> in prison <u>about the works of Christ</u>, he sent two of his disciples <sup>3</sup>and said to Him, "Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?" <sup>4</sup>Jesus answered and said to them, "Go and tell John the things which you hear and see: <sup>5</sup><u>The blind see and the</u> <u>lame walk</u>; the lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear; the dead are raised up and the poor have the gospel preached to them. (Mt 11:2-5)

D. <u>Jesus only did what the Father showed Him</u> – He walked in perfect harmony with God, thereby representing Him accurately by what He both said and did amongst the people.

<sup>34</sup> Jesus said to them, "<u>My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me</u>, and <u>to finish His work</u>. (Jn 4:34)

<sup>19</sup> Then Jesus answered and said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, <u>the Son can do</u> <u>nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do</u>; for <u>whatever He does, the Son also does</u> <u>in like manner</u>. (Jn 5:19)

<sup>38</sup> For <u>I have come down from heaven</u>, not to do My own will, but <u>the will of Him who sent Me</u>. (Jn 6:38)

#### II. JESUS' HEALING MINISTRY WAS CENTRAL TO HIS MESSAGE

A. Jesus' role as healer is fulfillment of Is 53:4-5

<sup>16</sup>When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And <u>He</u> cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, <sup>17</sup>that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "<u>He Himself took our infirmities And bore our</u> sicknesses." (Mt 8:16-17)

B. He was also the fulfillment of Is 61:1-2

<sup>18</sup> "The Spirit of the LORD is upon Me, Because <u>He has anointed Me</u> To <u>preach the gospel</u> to the poor; He has sent Me to <u>heal the brokenhearted</u>, To <u>proclaim liberty to the captives</u> And <u>recovery of sight to the blind</u>, To <u>set at liberty those who are oppressed</u>; (Lk 4:18)

C. Jesus' works were to validate His message and relationship with the Father.

<sup>36</sup>But I have a greater witness than John's; for the works which the Father has given Me to finish—the very works that I do—bear witness of Me, that the Father has sent Me. (Jn. 5:36)

<sup>11</sup>Believe Me that I am in the Father and the Father in Me, or <u>else believe Me for the sake of</u> <u>the works themselves</u>. (Jn. 14:11)

D. Healing was the "children's bread" to God's people (Syrophoenician Womans daughter's healing).

<sup>26</sup>But He answered and said, "It is not good to take <u>the children's bread</u> and throw it to the little dogs." <sup>27</sup>And she said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the little dogs eat the crumbs which fall from their masters' table." <sup>28</sup>Then Jesus answered and said to her, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be to you as you desire." And her daughter was healed from that very hour. (Mt 15:26-28)

# III. JESUS RELATED THE KINGDOM AND THE DEMONSTRATIONS OF POWER TOGETHER

<sup>23</sup>And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, <u>preaching the gospel of the</u> <u>kingdom, and healing all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease among the people</u>. <sup>24</sup>Then His fame went throughout all Syria; and <u>they brought to Him all sick people</u> who were afflicted with various diseases and torments, and those who were demon-possessed, epileptics, and paralytics; and <u>He healed them</u>. (Mt 4:23-24)

<sup>35</sup>Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, <u>preaching the gospel</u> <u>of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people</u>. (Mt 9:35)

<sup>28</sup>But <u>if I cast out demons by the Spirit of God, surely the kingdom of God has come upon you</u>. (Mt 12:28)

#### IV. JESUS PASSED ON HIS HEALING AUTHORITY AND POWER TO HIS FOLLOWERS

A. The twelve disciples sent out with authority and power.

<sup>1</sup>And when He had called His twelve disciples to Him, <u>He gave them power</u> over <u>unclean</u> <u>spirits</u>, <u>to cast them out</u>, and <u>to heal all kinds of sickness</u> and <u>all kinds of disease</u>... <sup>7</sup>And as you go, preach, saying, '<u>The kingdom of heaven is at hand</u>.' <sup>8</sup><u>Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers,</u> <u>raise the dead, cast out demons</u>. Freely you have received, freely give. (Mt 10:1, 7-8)

<sup>1</sup>Then <u>He called His twelve disciples</u> together and <u>gave them power and authority over all</u> <u>demons, and to cure diseases</u>. <sup>2</sup>He sent them to <u>preach the kingdom of God and to heal the</u> <u>sick</u>. (Lk. 9:1-2)

B. The seventy disciples sent out two by two with authority and power.

<sup>1</sup>...the Lord appointed <u>seventy others also</u>, and sent them two by two....<sup>9</sup>...<u>heal the sick</u> there, and say...'The <u>kingdom of God has come near to you</u>.'...<sup>19</sup>Behold, <u>I give you the authority to</u> trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you. (Lk 10:1, 9, 19)

C. All believers throughout Church history have access to Jesus' power.

<sup>12</sup> "Most assuredly, I say to you, <u>he who believes in Me</u>, <u>the works that I do he will do also</u>; and <u>greater works than these he will do</u>, because I go to My Father. (Jn. 14:12)

<sup>17</sup>And <u>these signs will follow those who believe</u>: <u>In My name</u> they will <u>cast out demons</u>; they will <u>speak with new tongues</u>; <sup>18</sup>they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will <u>lay hands on the sick, and they will recover</u>." (Mk 16:17-18)

#### V. HOLY SPIRIT'S MINISTRY—PROMISE OF POWER

<sup>49</sup>Behold, <u>I send the Promise of My Father upon you</u>; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are <u>endued with power from on high</u>." (Lk. 24:49)

<sup>8</sup>But <u>you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you</u>; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." (Ac 1:8)

<sup>5</sup>...He who supplies <u>the Spirit to you and works miracles among you</u>, ... (Gal. 3:5)

#### VI. APOSTOLIC WITNESS OF POWER

A. Apostolic prayer from the early church in Acts seeking healing and miraculous power.

<sup>29</sup>Now, Lord, look on their threats, and <u>grant to Your servants</u> that <u>with all boldness they may</u> <u>speak Your word</u>, <sup>30</sup>by <u>stretching out Your hand to heal</u>, and that <u>signs and wonders may be</u> <u>done through the name of Your holy Servant Jesus</u>." (Ac 4:29-30)

B. Apostles move in power.

<sup>33</sup>And with <u>great power</u> the <u>apostles gave witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus</u>. And great grace was upon them all. (Ac 4:33)

- C. Stephen the deacon moved in the power of signs and wonders. <sup>8</sup>And Stephen, full of faith and power, did great wonders and signs among the people. (Ac 6:8)
- D. Paul's understanding that the word of God should be accompanied by power.

<sup>4</sup>And <u>my speech and my preaching were not with persuasive words of human wisdom</u>, but in <u>demonstration of the Spirit and of power</u>, <sup>5</sup>that your faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God. (1 Co 2:4-5)

<sup>18</sup>Now some are puffed up...and I will know, <u>not the word of those who are puffed up</u>, but <u>the</u> <u>power</u>. <sup>20</sup>For <u>the kingdom of God is not in word but in power</u>. ... (1 Co 4:18-21)

### VII. OUR RESPONSE

- A. Read the gospels afresh and get a renewed vision of Jesus' demonstrations of power as central to effective ministry. Begin to seek God for a personal baptism of power and settle for nothing less than what Jesus has promised us (Jn 14.12; Lk 24:49; Acts 1:5,8).
- B. Make room in your time for real follow through. It's not enough to only desire healing, but to actually pray for the sick and expect results. Do not get discouraged at your lack of power; rather let it move you to ask and believe God for more.
- C. You do not need to have a certain personality type to make something happen in the spirit. Neither your poetic words nor your yelling volume scare demons or a move angels. Your authority before God does! Simply speak the name of Christ over the situation.
- D. Study about faith and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We are called to do our part and believe, and God will do His part and release power. Trust God for the outcome!
